NY REGULATIONS GOVERNING ONLINE COURSES

New York State Insurance Department regulates the structure and format of our ONLINE Pre-Licensing courses. A Certificate of Completion qualifies students to take the NYS Licensing Exam administered by PSI. **This is a Highly Structured Online Course and not a Self-Study Course**

OVERVIEW

1. WEB-EDsurance: Mastery of the Topical Content

- **Chapter Quizzes:** Pass each chapter quiz in sequence with a 70% Score
- **Practice Exams:** Unlimited attempts to qualify for your Monitored Final Exam
- **Score Report:** Measures Score Performance for each topic for every exam
- **Study Regiment:** Enhance Score Performance through Targeted Topical Study

2. Monitored Final Exam (MFx): 70% Passing grade earns Certificate of Completion

3. XAM-NET: Mastery of the NYSID Licensing Exam; Goal is passing on your 1st Attempt!

- **Green Light:** An Exam Sim with questions never seen taken 2 day before state exam

Sequential Chapter Progression: You Begin your study by *thoroughly* reading through the Entire Chapter. Each Chapter must be taken in order; You cannot progress to a new chapter until you pass each Chapter Quiz with a minimum score of 70%

Quiz Structure: Each Chapter Quiz has 7 multiple choice questions. You must correctly answer at least 5 of 7 questions to advance to the next chapter. You will receive feedback on how you answered each question, whether correct or incorrect at the end of quiz. The rationale for each question appears for every question regardless whether answered correctly or incorrectly.

PRACTICE FINAL EXAMS

Practice Finals are timed (3 Hours) and weighted with 50 less questions than the state licensing exam (NYSID standard). Practice exams replicate the The Monitored Final Exam in every way. The purpose of Practice Exams is measure Mastery of the Topical Content.

Every Practice Exam produces a Score Report. The Score Report is used as the foundation for the Study Regiment.

- **Score Report:** Your Score Report produces your overall score (grade) and shows you how you did in each Topical Area of your Exam. It shows you the number of questions asked in each topic; The number you answered correctly; and the percentage of correct answers for each topic.
- **Study Regiment:** The single most powerful tool for improving score results. The Study Regiment develops a personalized study program designed to increase retention and improve score results through systematic learning tools. Instructors will train and assist students on the proper use of the Study Regiment

The following qualifications **MUST** be achieved prior to having access to your Monitored Exam. These standards may change as the state licensing exam changes:

- Pass your 1st Practice Exam with a score of 80% or better, or
- Pass 2 consecutive Practice Exams with scores above 75%

FIND A MONITOR

Your Final Exam **MUST** be Monitored by a NYS Approved Monitor. The *first* MFX fee is included in tuition only if the student uses our Preferred Monitor Directory (PMD). The *student* is responsible to schedule their exam and to eMail the *date, time, and monitor name* to admin@globaledusa.com. The PMD is accessible to all students after they pass their first practice exam.

REGISTER FOR YOUR STATE LICENSING EXAM

If you have not registered with PSI Exams (\$49) you should do so when you schedule your Monitored Exam. **The perfect state exam date is 3 days after you pass your MFX.** PSI EXAMS ALLOWS WALK-IN REGISTRATION AND EXAM TAKING.

MFX: MONITORED FINAL EXAM

The Final Exam is composed of questions topically weighted exactly like the Licensing Exam except with 50 fewer questions. You are **PROHIBITED** from accessing your Final Exam without the presence of an Approved NYS Monitor.

ALL BREACHES OF THE FINAL EXAM MUST BE REPORTED TO THE NEW YORK STATE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT!

After passing your MFX your Monitor Must fax us a copy of their **Monitor Approval Document** and the completed and signed **Affidavit** before we can email you your **Course Completion Certificate**. An affidavit must be sent to GlobalED whether a student passes or fails their MFX.

A CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION WILL NOT BE ISSUED WITHOUT THE MONITOR APPROVAL DOCUMENT AND SIGNED AFFIDAVIT

XAM-NET™

Your State Exam has 50 additional questions. The focus of XAM-NET™ is to measure your ability to pass you state exam on your 1st attempt. XAM-NET™ begins with a review of the Licensing Exam and Exam-Taking Techniques.

1st EXAM SIM

You'll want to start by taking an Exam Simulation to see how you score on a 150 question exam that duplicates real exam conditions. The Sim seeks to evaluate two two critical aspects: (1) No Clock Pressure: 50 additional questions in 30 minutes less time; (2) No Drop in Score.

2nd STUDY REGIMENT

The study regiment is important after the Sim and is VITAL after the Green Light Exam

3rd GREEN LIGHT EXAM

The GREEN LIGHT EXAM is a one-time exam taken EXACTLY 2 DAYS BEFORE the NYS Licensing Exam. The Green Light Exam is a Mock Licensing Exam in the sense that it is composed of questions not seen before. The purpose is to expose remaining deficiencies with sufficient time to make necessary corrections. The Study Regiment and Targeted Topical Reading is VITAL at this stage.

4th CHEAT SHEET

Printed and read by student just prior to taking the State Exam. Designed to reinforce numerical items (dollar values, days and time periods) that we consider as exam minutia. This is a short term memory technique. The its ...
